

ENL101. English Composition I (Cape Cod Community College)

ENL101 is an introductory college composition course required of all students and prerequisite to all other college-level English courses. It is designed to help students develop and express ideas clearly and effectively using Standard American English through frequent writing and the study of rhetorical patterns of development. Students learn to write MLA style documented essays. **Prerequisite: Appropriate score on Computerized Placement Test or grade of C or better in ENL050 or ESL201 / 3 credits**

ENGL101. English Composition I (Massasoit C. College)

Credits: 3

English Composition I is a course designed to help students develop and organize extended pieces of writing. Students will focus on the correct and appropriate use of language and the organization and development of paragraphs and essays. Research techniques and documentation of sources will be included. Constant reading and frequent writing will be required. **Prerequisites: Preparing for College Reading I (ENGL091) and a grade of C- or higher in Introductory Writing (ENGL099) or waiver by placement testing results, or Departmental Approval.**

HUM102. Humanities: Perception through the Arts *** (Cape Cod Community College)

This course is an introduction to humanistic studies; it examines works of the human spirit (in music, painting, philosophy, sculpture, architecture, drama, poetry) which have influenced our civilization and who we are as individuals. **Prerequisite: ENL101 / 3 credits**

PHI130. Introduction to Philosophy (Cape Cod Community College)

This course provides the student with an introduction to six major issues in philosophy. Although the course is essentially an "isms" course, there will be substantial and focused emphasis on historical development. In every section of the course, original source materials will be read and used. **Prerequisite: Satisfactory basic skills assessment score / 3 credits**

THR207. Acting on Camera *** (Cape Cod Community College)

This course is intended for the intermediate actor to learn the specific acting and career management skills required to pursue professional work in film and television. Students will develop refined audition techniques for soap operas and all forms of television commercials. Students will learn about the business concepts and self-marketing skills used by performers in film and television, focusing on how actors fit into this market place and how to enhance their own unique talents as saleable qualities. **Prerequisite: THR103 / 3 credits**

***** These courses have college level pre-requisites, but may appeal to adult learners who have started work on degrees at other times or in other places. Some high school students may have enough theater experience to meet the prerequisite for Acting on Camera.**
